



#### Eliminate the use of Plastic

#### (2011-12)

Title of Practice: Promote 'Say No to Plastic' amongst Society and Students.

Goal:

- To make the Society aware of the disadvantages of Plastic.
- To pave the way for reducing the use of plastic.
- To organize various programmes in order to promote the concept, 'Say No to Plastic'.

#### The Context:

The plastic persists in the environment for a very long period, representing a significant waste impact. The combination of long life and high levels of consumption mean that plastic can place pressure on landfill capacity.

#### The practice:

The initiatives taken by the College for reducing the use of plastic in day to day use of the people in Society:

- 1. Expert lectures are arranged for students
- 2. In association with NGO's, Sports club, Nagar parishad and Gram Panchayat, an awareness campaign is conducted once in a semester in Nagar parishad and adjacent Gram panchayats.
- 3. Collection of plastics at the public places and roadsides by students of NSS unit on every Sunday.
- 4. Initiated a College wide ban on single use water bottles.
- 5. Installed a sustainable water dispenser.
- 6. Ordered all employees to use refillable sports water bottle.
- 7. Distributed literature to employees and students on the Harmful effects of plastic water bottle waste.
- 8. Students from rural areas identified, encouraged and often assisted to create awareness of the activity.
- 9. Innovative ideas for elimination of plastic are provided to concerned authorities.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

- People are avoiding plastic and making use of Glass or Metal pots for buying the goods from the market.
- They are in search of items with no or very less packaging.
- People started bringing containers and bags to store and refill or reuse them.
- Started purchasing items in containers that can be refilled.
- Students started drinking filtered tap water, fill their own bottle with water and reuse so as to eliminate waste and save money.
- Buying products made with recycled materials, such as, recycled paper and glass.

• Reducing and reusing started diverting millions of tons of garbage from landfills every year.

#### **Problems Encountered:**

- Difficult to change the habits of people.
- Difficult to contact the manufacture of products whose packaging isn't recyclable and ask them to use better packaging.
- Time and financial constraints.
